The Conditionals

Zero Conditional	If Mark is ill, you always let him stay at home. I don't make a fuss, if I'm ill. Do I have to go to work, if I'm ill? When you feel ill, you always make a fuss.
First Conditional	If you aren't well, I'll call the doctor. I'll feel better if I stay at home. Will you call me if you hear any news? You won't pass your exam, if you don't study more. When I get to the airport, I'll check my bag in.
Second Conditional	I would be exhausted if I went to the gym every day. You wouldn't eat a salad even if it was the only thing on the menu! What would you do if you had more free time? I would go to London if I could .
Third Conditional	If I had saved enough money, I would have bought a new car. I wouldn't have gone to the party if I had known it finished so late. What would you have done if you had won the lottery? If you had given me your phone number, I would have called you.

The Passive

Present Simple Passive	Fleece is used to make all kinds of clothes. Rice isn't grown in the UK. How is fleece made ? They are melted and put in a special machine. They aren't all used to make fleece. Where are cars made ?
Past Simple Passive	The first fleece was made in 1979. Recycled plastic wasn't used until 1993. When was the telephone invented ? The actors were booed off the stage by the audience. The students weren't given a test on Monday. When were the first e-mails sent ?
